- Keep Pets Under Control



## Stop, Stand, and Speak

- Stop all movement can be perceived as aggressive.
- Stand to the side, downhill is best if safe, anything above the head is a predator.
- Speak smile! Horses can read your face.
   Say "Hello, how are you?" or "It's a nice day."
   Speak clearly, but don't shout.

Take off your pack, remove your helmet, Get off your bike (ORV), ask what you can do.
