

Cassidy Creek

This is a huge area of interconnected DNR lands, so dogs are ok, but so are bikes, motorized and otherwise. On the main roads and trails it is easy to spot other users, but less so on the many twisty, narrow trails that meander through these lands.

Getting There

Take 101 to Hooker Road, but turn right onto Atterberry Road in $\frac{1}{4}$ mi. Follow Atterberry for a bit over 2 miles then turn left onto Cassidy Road. The parking lot is basically at the junction of Cassidy Road and Cassidy Creek Road. It's the small red circle shown on the map below. Cassidy Creek road is the one that goes past the yellow gate for another 4 miles or so and makes a good out and back ride of its own.

Parking

The lot is not that big and has lots of potholes, so there's not always a lot of space for more than a couple of horse trailers, especially if there are several cars in the lot.

There are numerous trails, as the map below shows. A popular loop is the one shown in blue, but there are lots of loops possible that come off of the road following the power line. That's the straight line shown through the area.
