Thank you for your interest and willingness to volunteer. The intent of this host program is to provide some additional coverage and attention to the Littleton Horse Camp. This campground is open to everyone but has been specially designed for horse users. We support posting signs, reserving sites for the camp host, and prioritizing two sites for horse users but want to remind you all that everyone is welcome to use this campground. If the designated sites are not occupied by 6pm please allow anyone to take this camp site. Below are a few things we would like you to do and keep in mind during your volunteer weekend:

- Call Meg Fluharty (406-600-5466) on Friday before arriving at Littleton to establish communications with Olympic National Forest Recreation Staff
- If you see suspicious activity or obvious concerns about safety please call 911
 - The general guiding principal is: Pretend like the campground is your home – if something is going on that would dictate you calling 911 at home then do the same as the camp host
- Call PSICC (Puget Sound Dispatch) if you are not getting the 911 response you need. Their hours are 7am – 7pm every day of the week.
- Recreation staff, LEOs (FS law enforcement), Fire personnel, and Puget Sound Dispatch are all aware that you are volunteering and will do a patrol if they are in the area.
