

Littleton Horse Camp Volunteer Camp Host Program

Thank you for volunteering at Littleton Horse Camp as a Camp Host! The camp host site is site number 4. It is recommended that you arrive on Friday early afternoon for the weekend that you are signed up for. At the end of your camp host stay, please fill out the Camp Host Report located on the clipboard and/or email the report to Liz at elizabeth.cusanelli@usda.gov.

Camp Host Duties:

- Answer questions from visitors and campers. See the next page for FAQ.
- Keep track of the number of campers that you interact with for the weekend (this helps our funding/visitor use tracking)
- Encourage visitors to pay the campground fee. If you are having issues with campers not paying the fee, contact Liz. Remind them that campground fees go directly towards the maintenance of the campground.
 - Fees: The Forest is moving to cashless, so help encourage visitors to use the [Recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov) app to pay for camping. A cash option will be available as long as possible, but eventually we will not accept cash at the site.
- Light vault toilet cleaning: refill toilet paper, sweep floor, wipe down seats if needed. The toilet should be cleaned by FS staff or contractor a few times per week, so this will just be as needed. Cleaning supplies, toilet paper and gloves will be provided.
- At the end of your stay, please fill out the Camp Host Report. This will help us understand any issues that are happening and how we can support you.

- Must be a Forest Service volunteer so that you are covered in the case of any incident. **If you are an official Backcountry Horseman member, you are covered.**
- Have a friendly, positive and welcoming attitude.
- Do your best to resolve issues and know when things are out of your hands.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Where can I go fishing?
 - Many pull-offs along Highway 101 in the area access the Sol Duc; West Snider Road, FS 2918 road, Bear Creek area.
 - Calawah River closer to Forks anywhere off of FS 2900 road.
- Where is the closest food/full-service town?
 - Forks is the closest full-service town about 30 minutes west on Highway 101.
- Where is the closest gas?
 - Burnt Mountain Fuel in Sappho, about 15 minutes west on Highway 101.
- Where can I take shower?
 - Lake Pleasant RV Park, Beaver, about 20 minutes west on Highway 101.
 - Forks Athletic Club, Forks, about 30 minutes west on Highway 101.
- Where is the closest major city?
 - Port Angeles, WA, about 50 minutes east on Highway 101.
- I wanted to go to Fairholme and Sol Duc Campgrounds but they are full. Where else can I camp in the area?
 - Klahowya Campground is a first come first serve campground, about 5 miles west of Littleton.
 - Dispersed camping along FS Road 2918.
- Where can I hike?
 - Easiest/family friendly: Olympic Discovery Trail from Camp Creek, from FS 2918, or Mt. Muller.
 - Moderate to challenging: Mt. Muller Loop, Kloshe Nanitch Lookout
 - Mountain biking: ODT, Mt Muller Loop, Snider Ridge, Kloshe Nanitch Lookout
 - Horse riding: ODT, Mt Muller Loop, Snider Ridge, Kloshe Nanitch Lookout

National Park Information

- Fairholme and Sol Duc Campgrounds are reservation only. You can still visit Sol Duc Hot Springs for a day trip.
- The Storm King Ranger Station is the closest Ranger Station. Other Ranger Stations are Mora in La Push, and Kalaloch. Hours vary, so recommend checking online for their current conditions/hours.
- Ruby Beach/Kalaloch are about 1-1.5 hours away depending on traffic.
- The Hoh is about 1-1.5 hours away depending on traffic. Weekends will have very long backups at the Hoh entry station (anticipate several hours).
- I want to see the rainforest. Where do I go?
 - Hoh area
 - Bogachiel Rainforest Trail for a less crowded experience (Forest Service)
 - Quinault area
- I want to go to the beach. Where do I go?
 - Recommend checking online for conditions, but here are ONP options: La Push/Mora, Rialto Beach, Kalaloch, First/Second/Third/Fourth Beach, Ruby Beach
